INSTRUCTIONS FOR REGISTRATION

Please carefully read these instructions **before** completing the form for registration. General and attorney applicants who intend to seek admission to practice law in California must register in accordance with the Business and Professions Code, Article 4, Section 6060(2)(d), and Rule V of the *Rules Regulating Admission to Practice Law in California (Rules)*. The registration form is not an application to take an examination.

Answer all applicable questions on the registration form. Answers must be specific and complete. If the space for an answer is insufficient, the answer may be completed on a separate sheet of paper, which should be attached to the registration form. Before filing the registration, please check to see that all questions have been answered, the registration is signed and the correct fee is included. Any registration not meeting these requirements is considered incomplete and will not be considered filed until it is brought to a complete status. If there are deficiencies in the registration form, you will be notified. **Registrations that are not brought to a complete and filed status within 60 days of receipt will be abandoned. No refund of fees will be paid in the event a registration is abandoned.**

After completing and signing the registration form, the form and correct fees in the form of a personal check, cashier's check or money order payable to the State Bar of California must be mailed to the following address:

If an applicant has registered previously, there is no need to complete the registration form or pay the fee. General applicants are required to file the registration form within 90 days after beginning law study and must be accompanied by the appropriate fee. If more than 90 days have elapsed since beginning the study of law, the general applicant registration must be accompanied by an additional late filing fee.

Caution: Separate and distinct application forms are required for the bar examination and moral character determination. The Application to Take the California Bar Examination and/or Application for Determination of Moral Character will not be processed prior to completion of the registration form.

All correspondence from the Committee of Bar Examiners (Committee) and the State Bar's Office of Admissions will be mailed to the current mailing address (initially as shown on the registration form). It is the applicant's responsibility to notify the State Bar's Office of Admissions **in writing**, of any changes in name, address or law school. If notification of such changes is not received by the State Bar's Office of Admissions, it may result in the applicant's failure to receive important information.

It is the applicant's responsibility to maintain compliance with the *Rules*. Copies of amendments to the *Rules* are not routinely sent to registrants. The current *Rules* are available online at www.calbar.ca.gov/admissions or upon request from the Office of Admission.

Law students with bachelor's degrees and attorneys are exempt from pre-legal education certification. All others **must** attach transcripts of their pre-legal study to their registration form. Additionally, their law school will be required to certify to the Committee of Bar Examiners of The State Bar of California that they have satisfied the pre-legal education requirements of Rule VII of the *Rules*. Once the registration is filed, a pre-legal education certification form will be mailed to the law school. If the form is not completed and returned within 45 days, the applicant will be notified. Failure by the law school to submit the required certification in a timely manner will delay the processing of the applicant's registration.

General information to assist in completing the registration form follows:

QUESTION #1.1 - UNITED STATES SOCIAL SECURITY NUMBER

All applicants for admission to practice law in California are required to provide a social security number pursuant to Business and Professions Code Section 30 (State of California's tax enforcement provisions) and Family Code Section 17520 (Child Support Enforcement Programs).

QUESTION #1.3 - APPLICANT TYPE

Applicants for admission to practice law in California are categorized as either general applicants or attorney applicants.

A general applicant has not been admitted to practice law in any United States or foreign jurisdiction.

An attorney applicant has been admitted to practice law in any United States or foreign jurisdiction. United States attorneys may apply to take either the Attorneys' Examination or General Bar Examination as specified in the *Rules*. The Committee will make the final determination regarding the attorney's eligibility for either examination.

Foreign attorney applicants are not eligible to apply for the Attorneys' Examination and must apply to take the General Bar Examination.

QUESTION #2.0 - NAMES, FORMER NAMES AND ALIASES

If an applicant's name has been changed by court order, a photocopy of such order should be attached. This includes divorce decrees or dissolution papers.

QUESTION #2.1 - LEGAL EDUCATION

All law study completed or currently in progress should be indicated, even though there is no intention to claim credit.

If an applicant obtained his or her legal education outside of the United States and has not been admitted to practice law, he or she must file an application for Evaluation of Foreign Law Study to determine eligibility to take the California Bar Examination. It is suggested that this be done prior to filing an Application to Take the California Bar Examination to avoid payment of the application fee, a portion of which is not refundable, in the event eligibility is not established.

QUESTION #2.2 - FIRST-YEAR LAW STUDENTS' EXAMINATION

Pursuant to Rule VIII, Section 1, *Rules*, every person who intends to seek admission as a general applicant shall take the First-Year Law Students' Examination (FYLSX) following completion of one year of law study unless such person: (1) has passed the bar examination of a United States jurisdiction, possession, territory, or dependency the United States may hereinafter acquire or of a country where the common law of England constitutes the basis of jurisprudence; or (2) has satisfactorily completed the first year course of instruction in a law school accredited by the Committee or approved or provisionally approved by the American Bar Association at the time of applicant's matriculation or at the time applicant completes the first year of instruction and had completed at least two years of college work as defined in Rule VII, Section 1 of the *Rules* prior to matriculating in such accredited or approved law school.

If exemption from the FYLSX cannot be established, that examination may be taken upon completion of the applicant's first year of law study (Rule VIII, Section 1, *Rules*). The examination is administered in Los Angeles and San Francisco in June and October each year. Applications to take that examination are available online at www.calbar.ca.gov/admissions or upon request from either the San Francisco or Los Angeles office and must be filed in accordance with the deadlines specified in Rule VI, Section 5, *Rules*. The subjects included in the examination are Contracts, Torts, and Criminal Law. Applicants who establish eligibility for the FYLSX prior to January 1, 1997 shall not receive credit for any law study completed until he or she has passed the examination nor shall he or she receive credit for any law study completed subsequent to the first year and prior to passing the FYLSX.

Applicants who establish eligibility for the FYLSX on or after January 1, 1997 and who pass the examination within three consecutive administrations of first becoming eligible to take the examination shall receive credit for all law study completed to the date of the administration of the examination passed. An applicant who does not pass the examination within three consecutive administrations of first becoming eligible to take the examination but who subsequently passes the examination shall receive credit for his or her **first year of law study only**.

QUESTION #2.3 - GENERAL EDUCATION

All college level study completed prior to beginning law study (undergraduate study only) must be indicated. Pursuant to Rule VII, *Rules*, every general applicant for admission to practice law must have (a) completed at least two years (60 semester or 90 quarter units) of college work applicable to a baccalaureate degree at a regionally accredited (approved) school or, (b) may satisfy the general education requirement of Rule VII by attaining certain scores on the following examinations administered by the College Level Examination Program (CLEP):

1. English Composition (or) English Composition with Essay; and
2. Two of the following:
 - Humanities
 - Mathematics
 - Natural Sciences
 - Social Sciences and History

The credit granting score for each examination is 50 or higher.

QUESTION #2.4 - PRIOR ADMISSION TO PRACTICE LAW - FOR ATTORNEY APPLICANTS ONLY

An attorney applicant must submit a current Certificate of Good Standing (CGS), affixed with the seal of the admitting authority from the jurisdiction(s) where he/she is currently an active member of the bar.

SUSPENDED OR DISBARRED ATTORNEYS

Please note that while attorneys who are suspended or disbarred in another jurisdiction are permitted to register as attorney applicants and file applications to take the bar examination, Rule VI, Section 2(b) of the *Rules* prevents them from filing a moral character determination application while so disciplined.

TESTING ACCOMMODATIONS FOR APPLICANTS WITH DISABILITIES

Applicants with disabilities are encouraged to make arrangements for testing accommodations well in advance of an examination.

Testing accommodations are available to individuals with a mental or physical disability as defined under the American with Disabilities Act of 1990, that limits them from taking and passing an examination in a manner that is comparable to all other applicants. Depending on the nature of the disability, accommodations may include assistants (i.e. readers, helpers, etc.) wheelchair access, permission to dictate, customized timing, separate testing room, customized examination materials (i.e. braille, large print, etc.), and permission to bring and use specific items or medical aids. Certain items such as pillows, wrist braces, book stands, special chairs, foot stools, swimmers' ear plugs, etc., may be permitted upon inspection and approval by staff at the test center prior to the start of the examination. The Committee does not offer or recommend to any applicant specific types of accommodations. The applicant and his/her physician/specialist should request what they think is necessary to allow the applicant to compete on an equal basis with all other applicants.

Documentation on the Committee's forms is required to process a request.

The Committee's policies, procedures and forms to file a petition for testing accommodations may be obtained online at www.calbar.ca.gov/admissions or upon request.

ALL petitions must be filed separately from the application for the examination. The processing of any petition without the requested documentation may be delayed. All incomplete petitions will be returned. See addendum for deadline. DEADLINES WILL NOT BE EXTENDED.

Listed on **Appendix A** are the law school codes to indicate all law study completed or currently in progress. If your law school is not listed, please use code 9999 in the spaces provided. If additional spaces are needed, please attach a sheet.

QUESTION #9 - Jurisdiction

Listed on **Appendix B** are the jurisdiction codes to indicate all jurisdictions to which you have been admitted. If your jurisdiction is not listed, please use code ZZ in the spaces provided.

WITHDRAWAL/ABANDONMENT/INELIGIBLE

Registration applications may not be withdrawn. Fees for registration applications that are abandoned because they are incomplete will not be refunded. Applicants for registration found to be ineligible due to either a lack of pre-legal education or a failure to provide proof of admission to another jurisdiction will qualify for a refund.

REGISTRATION NUMBER

A registration number will be assigned. The registration number is the permanent identification number and must be indicated on all subsequently filed applications and on all correspondence. Registration confirmation letters will be mailed approximately four (4) weeks from the date of approval of the registration.

COMMUNICATING WITH THE COMMITTEE OF BAR EXAMINERS/OFFICE OF ADMISSIONS

An official record of all communications is required. All inquiries must be submitted in writing and sent to the Office of Admissions in San Francisco or Los Angeles. This will enable the staff to review the inquirer's record prior to responding and to provide precise rather than generalized responses.
